I, IRA TAKA of Manurewa, retired Mother, swear:

- 1. I was born at Waikarakia on 28 July 1935 and am the mother of nine children.
- 2. I am the sister of Taka O Te Rangi Taka who has brought this Treaty claim for and on behalf of my tupuna Wi Taka and any other Ngati Koheriki who may wish to join his claim. I fully tautoko his claim.
- <u>MY</u> knowledge relating to Ngati Koheriki comes from information I received about 1994 from my Aunty Mere Taka, who has since passed away, and what I have since learned from Dr Rigby.
- 4. <u>About</u> 1993 I began having dreams in which my father told me to round up all his mokopuna and for them to tidy up all the otaota, weeds and rubbish.
- 5. <u>SOON</u> after my children and I became involved with this matter and I became more aware of my Ngati Koheriki side. I believe that through my dreams my wairua or spirit was crying out for my whanau and I to find out the truth about Ngati Koheriki.
- 6. <u>ALTHOUGH</u> much of the knowledge relating to our East Wairoa whenua and Ngati Koheriki has been lost, we have always understood the importance of whenua.
- 7. <u>MY</u> tupuna were granted land at Waikarakia and we as a whanau have maintained that land as guardians ever since.

- IN 1955 my tupuna tried to establish a marae for our whanau to be called Ngati Tamatira. I believe that Ngati Tamatira is a hapu of Ngati Koheriki.
- 9. <u>AS</u> the land was subject to a Government loan (Maori Affairs I believe), a marae reservation could not be declared until 40 years later when the loan was repaid.
- 10. <u>I</u> am hopeful that justice is done and that Ngati Koheriki will receive from the Crown an appropriate apology for the loss of our whenua that was confiscated at East Wairoa.
- 11. <u>THE</u> Crown should also return our whenua and provide Ngati Koheriki with adequate compensation for the loss of our whenua and the hardship suffered by our tupuna and their descendents.
