(There is an abundance of food on Moehau if you are a person who is prepared to seek it)

The purpose of this booklet is to provide a list of phrases used in Hauraki. It has been placed in this format because it is intended for a specific audience, one that might want to use these phrases on a daily basis.

Some words and phrases are not uniquely Hauraki because over a period of time words and phrases from outside Hauraki have been incorporated into the Hauraki vernacular. What our kuia and koroua have indicated is that the words and phrases included in this document have been used by them or heard by them in our community.

The concept of *Ono ki te Waru* is to have a list of common phrases that our tamariki – mokopuna can use between Six in the morning and Eight at night. The time frame covers getting up, having a wash, having breakfast and going to school. In the afternoon it involves coming home after school, getting ready for tea, getting ready to go out or getting ready for bed. There is some overlapping of time but the phrases are still relevant.

Our kuia koroua have confirmed that these phrases, while not necessarily unique to Hauraki, are nevertheless used in Hauraki.
